ORDINANCE NO. 98-4

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THE
 PERMANENT CLOSING OF AN UNUSED AND
 UNOPENED TWENTY-FIVE (25) FOOT
 RIGHT OF WAY BETWEEN 820 AND 824
 GLEN LEVEN DRIVE

WHEREAS, a petition was filed by interested and affected property owners with the Municipal Planning Commission of Oak Hill, Tennessee, seeking the official closing and abandonment of a twenty-five foot wide unopened and unused right of way, described as follows: "Beginning where the southerly line of Lot 29, Revised Plat of parts of Thompson Glen Leven Subdivision, intersects with Glen Leven Road, thence east along the southerly lines of Lots 29 and 21 a distance of 656.3' more or less, to the westerly right of way line of Newman place, thence with said right of way line south 25', thence west parallel to and 25' from the first above described line a distance of 656.3' more or less, to a point in the easterly right of way line of Glen Leven Road, thence with said right of way north a distance of 25' to the point of beginning".

WHEREAS, said Municipal Planning Commission has recommended to the Commissioners of Oak Hill that said right of way be officially closed and abandoned; and


WHEREAS, after written notice by the City Manager to all affected property owners and the holding of a public meeting at the time and place set out in said notice, the Commissioners of the City of Oak Hill find that said right of way is unopened and unused and it is unlikely that it will ever be used; and is not a means of ingress or egress to any property owner; and the Commissioners have determined that the closing of said right of way will be in the best public interest:

Section 1. Now therefore, be it ordained by the Commissioner of the City of Oak Hill that the twenty five (25) foot right of way above described be and the same is hereby abandoned and closed for road, alley or street purposes, forever;

Section 2. Be it further resolved, that this Ordinance take affect after final adoption; the public welfare requiring it.
