HALL INCOME TAX

One of the largest revenue streams for the City of Oak Hill is the Hall Income Tax. This is a tax required by the State of Tennessee and paid (if required) on your annual State of Tennessee Income Tax Return.

The amount paid to the State is divided between the State and the local community. In order for the local community to receive their share, a resident must include the city and county information on the return. There are two boxes in the top center portion of your return.

Please enter Oak Hill in the city box and Davidson County in the County box.

It is unusual for a citizen to live in a community and not have a mailing address that reflects that community's name. Since Oak Hill residents have a different mailing address, if the code is not indicated on the individual tax return, then the City of Oak Hill does not get credit for the tax.

It is important to understand that you are legally obligated to pay the tax regardless of what community you live in. It does not cost any more if you live in Oak Hill. So if you file your Tennessee tax return without including Oak Hill in the box on the form, then the income tax you pay will go to the community that is addressed on your form. For example, if Nashville is your mailing address and you don't include Oak Hill in the box on the form, then the income tax you pay will go to Nashville.

GARBAGE/RECYCLING SERVICES

Previously, the City paid \$440,000 per year to provide garbage/ recycling services to the residents of Oak Hill. Two years ago, the City bid and changed garbage companies and switched to once a week service. The new cost annually for this service is \$370,000. The annual savings from this change per year with the new contract is approximately \$70,000.

The existing contract is with Clean Earth LLC for 3 years expiring in February, 2020.

Clean Earth picks up garbage and recycling once a week on Monday (Everything south of Tyne) and Tuesday (Everything north of Tyne). Please make sure that all garbage is in black or white bags and all recycling is in blue or clear bags.

Recycling does not include glass of any kind. You can either take your glass that you would like to recycle to one of the centers around Davidson County or you can place your glass in your garbage. GLASS CANNOT BE INCLUDED IN YOUR RECYCLING.

BOARD OF COMMISSIONER WORK SESSION

The Board of Commissioners have scheduled a work session for Monday, January 22, 2018 at 3:00 p.m. at Oak Hill city hall.

The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the loss of the Hall Income Tax and how the city will address an approximate \$400,000 annual loss of revenue.

The board will be discussing the possibility of passing the cost of garbage and recycling on to the citizens. Currently, the city pays about \$370,000 per year for garbage and recycling services.

BUDGET REPORT

The City has completed six months of the fiscal year 2017-2018. The Hall Income Tax is down this year from \$462,000 to \$375,000. The State has lowered the rate by 1% for next year. This will result in a 16% reduction in the amount the city receives. The initial estimate is that our Hall Income Tax revenue for next year will be about \$300,000. It will continue to be reduced by 1% per year until it is eliminated.

Other than income tax, all other revenue line items are equal to or greater than last year. Building permit revenue is up by \$50,000 year to date.

From an expense standpoint, the City's overall budget is about the same as one year ago. Street lighting has increased due to a rate change per NES. This line item is up from \$14,000 to \$28,000.

The existing budget also includes \$228,000 for capital projects in reference to street improvements and drainage issues.

The City is in a solid cash position and the budget looks good half way through the fiscal year. The City has \$4,200,000 in investments.

CODE BOOK

The City has been working over the past several months on updating the code book. This is done through a process known as codification. An outside company takes all city ordinances and assembles them into an organized book by topic for ease in reading and understanding.

This process has not been done over several years; to a point where it has been difficult to understand what the current regulations should be.

After the completion of this process (late winter), the city will then update the code once or twice a year to ensure that all ordinances are current and accurate in this newly revised code book.

This process will make finding existing regulations and requirements much easier. As part of the process, the newly revised code will be made available on line with a link on our existing website (www.oakhilltn.us).
