



What is the Emerald Ash Borer?

The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), Agrilus planipennis, is an invasive species of beetle that was introduced through a shipment of ash tree lumber from China to Michigan. The EAB has spread throughout the eastern part of the United States for the past two decades, and will soon become a national issue that affects national forest, parks, and private residences.

EAB has arrived in Tennessee and a number of counties are already under quarantine. This quarantine includes closely monitoring wood movement, such as firewood and processed wood, to make sure no contaminated wood carries the bugs further. In September, 2014, the EAB was detected in the Nashville area. Unfortunately, someone apparently transported infested wood to the area, causing the pest to arrive several years earlier than expected. This leaves Nashville residents with little time to plan if they hope to preserve ash trees in their neighborhoods.
